LJUBLJANICA – A QUIET HAVEN IN THE MIDDLE OF THE CITY Why I have chosen this topic?

He was born in Ljubljana and has lived with it as long as he can remember. When he was a child, he spent a lot of time with his grandparents in Barje (the Ljubljana Marshes), where he liked to explore nature.

Later he worked as a teacher in a grammar school and spent long summer holidays at the sea, where he worked as a skipper, teaching tourists how to sail. He was also an active

member of the Ljubljana diving club.

He remembers how unbelievably live the Ljubljanica river became during the war in Croatia. The citizens of Ljubljana were not able to go to the Adriatic Sea and stayed at home due to the war, and they were using their boats on the Ljubljanica river.

Despite inadequate legislation, he managed to make and launch his first boat and started sailing on the Ljubljanica river thirteen years ago. At first only occasionally for casual groups, and gradually he started with tourist rides.

Today he has three boats and several captains, who work for him. He participates also in a European project for the setting up of professional basis for sailing and is the keeper of the navigational route of the Ljubljanica river, including the care for cleaning of the river banks.

I hope we will have an opportunity to sail with him, so that he will be able to tell us some interesting things.
