We could have animated our students of ethnology or anthropology to study the subject. But no! This would not have been a good idea and it would have taken a lot of time. Asking our student painters to paint bread. Yes, that would have been fine and we still might do it. Asking our students to concentrate on interpreting literary texts on bread. The idea did not seem to be guite original. Finally, asking our students of journalism to deal with different aspects of bread making interviews with a variety of interviewees from different socio-economic categories was thought to be the best choice. In the group of student journalists there are two photographers and their contribution, the portraits of the interviewees , will be welcome. Single articles have already been published in a national daily newspaper, an internet publication in Slovene and English is being prepared and could be used as a basis for establishing yet another thematic itinerary through the town of Ljubljana "Ljubljana's Bread Tour" (to be added to those developed for the project Personal Town Tours).
