PROJECT DEVELOPMENTS

3rd transnational project meeting
was held in Milan, Italy on
November 13th-14th, 2017

The project partners met in Milan for a transnational meeting devoted to finalising the training materials.

We are happy to share the final overview of the training course! The course will consist of 5 modules:

Module 1 will be an introduction to basic digital skills (like getting familiar with hardware, using the browser or a text editor).

Module 2 will introduce you to basic web programming, with languages like HTML, CSS and Javascript. Here, you will also create your own little web app!

Module 3 will provide you with important elements of computational thinking, introducing you to transversal skills. You will learn how to analyse issues and solve problems through digital skills.

Module 4 will go even deeper into the basics of computer programming – introducing you to more programming languages.

Module 5 – Coding everyday – will show you lots of examples of coding in everyday services. You will be surprised about your new level of understanding of a lot of these!

MESSAGES FROM SLOVENIA



During the European Coding Week at Slovenian Third Age University took place an animation training for their students. Digital exclusion (of older people) leads to inner social divisions as well as weakening of social ties which does no good to anybody; not to digital natives born after 1990, nor does it do any good to older people who will always be migrants in the digital world. (Dušana Findeisen).

There are no specific data on older people, but in the age category 15-74 in Slovenia (ranking the 17th among European countries as concern the digital index) there are approx. 43% of those who at least once a week use computer programmes on the basic level. Karina Sirk presented the results of the Silver Code project and it seems that the interest of older people for programming is high (more than 40% of respondents confirmed it). The participants in this introductory training in the field of coding confirmed it as well. They are

interested in changing algorithms, they are experienced (skeletal muscles and programming). They are familiar with binary counting. Some know how to compose an algorithm. They got enthusiastic about coding without computer: how to make a rode in a village where there is little money at the disposals of the municipality village In the Muddy Valley...

This part of the training was conducted by Katja Koren Ošljak, ambasadrice of coding (Source: Karina Sirk). A week later the findings from this training were presented by the three teachers on the national radio, Slovenia 1.

A MESSAGE FROM ROMANIA

Between 7-8 July 2017, the 5th International Conference "Education, Reflection, Development" took place in Cluj-Napoca. The ERD Conference was dedicated to the advancement of theories and practices in education. The conference aimed to promote collaboration between academics and professionals from the field of education, to provide opportunities for academics and professionals from various educational fields and with cross-disciplinary interests, to bridge the knowledge gaps in their areas of interest and to share the results of various evidence-based researches in education.

In the framework of this conference we presented the Romanian SILVER-CODE survey highlighting the potential of ICT use in seniors' education and a number of potential strategies that can be efficiently used. An innovative perspective addressed in the article was the development of digital curriculum in adult education, organized and implemented in contexts of collaborative learning.

Between 8-9 September 2017, the NOVAMOOC International Conference "New Trends and

Perspectives in Open Education", took place in Timisoara. Among topics of interest, we could mention open education, open pedagogy, tools and technologies supporting open education, platforms for MOOC hosting, strategies/models for MOOCs: video/content creation, facilitation, assessment, student motivation, quality assurance, certification and accreditation, open badges, MOOCs and flipped classrooms/blended learning. We took this opportunity to present the project idea and objectives, giving arguments for why teach elders to learn and highlighting the basic digital skills to be developed. Flower Watering JavaScript application was presented as part of the course which will start this autumn and also other examples with pieces of code were presented.
